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Summary

Nominee Profile

Steve joined WWF 18 months ago as Head of Corporate Engagement, with a focus on Asia Pacific countries, in the Market Transformation Initiative (MTI). The goal of the MTI is to make the production and consumption of priority soft commodities, including palm oil, more sustainable.

He has also engaged with priority industry platforms, especially the Consumer Goods Forum (CGF) and the European Brands Association. In 2016 he was the lead author of a WWF report "The Slow Road to Sustainability" which analysed the performance of CGF member companies versus their commitments to source commodities sustainably.

Steve is based in Malaysia, where he has lived in total for more than 10 years. Prior to joining WWF, Steve worked in marketing and sales positions for FMCG companies, including over 20 years with Nestle. He has worked in several countries including UK, Malaysia, China, Russia, Switzerland and Romania. He has a degree in Geography and attended several management courses at IMD Business School in Switzerland.
