1. Operational Profile

1.1 What are the main activities of your organisation?

At the Earth Innovation Institute, we are committed to finding and formulating solutions related to rural development together with efforts to maintain the sustainability of tropical forest ecosystems and meet the socio-economic needs of local and regional communities. By using a sustainable jurisdiction approach, our current works are to support more sustainable primary commodities production in Indonesia, Peru, Brazil and Colombia.

Earth Innovation Institute, Äôs goal in Indonesia is to build upon the political support in selected regions for a transition to low-deforestation, productive rural development (LED-R) to achieve multi-stakeholder consensus in support of this agenda. EII, through collaboration with Inovasi Bumi (INOBU) an Indonesian NGO, has been working with sub-national governments in Central Kalimantan Province, Indonesia. Through this collaboration, EII supports sustainable commodity production and transformation of the supply chain of oil palm and a goal of having the jurisdictions certified based on RSPO Principles and Criteria.

- 1.3 What activities has your organisation undertaken to publicise programmes to support RSPO, RSPO certification, uptake of RSPO-certified sustainable palm oil and oil palm products and/or good standing RSPO members during the year?
- 1. We carried out facilitation to RSPO/ISPO certification in three villages in Kotawaringin Barat District and two villages in Seruyan District, Central Kalimantan Province, Indonesia. As of December 2018, 708 smallholders with a total area of 1.425, 42 hectares in Pangkalan Tiga village, 214 smallholders with a total area of 399, 27 hectares in Lada Mandala Jaya village and 204 smallholders with a total area of 338, 38 hectares in Pangkalan Dewa village have participated in RSPO/ISPO certifications.
- 2. Our current work is supporting Seruyan District Government in piloting the implementation of legal instruments for protecting and managing the environment, which will support the conservation of High Conservation Value and High Carbon Stock areas are conserved at the jurisdictional area, supporting the jurisdictional certification process. The main instruments that have been piloted are the Strategic Environmental Assessment (Kajian Lingkungan Hiudp Strategis KLHS) and the Environmental Protection and Management Plan (Rencana Perlindungan dan Pengelolaan Lingkungan Hidup RPPLH). The first step in this process was the recently completed Environmental Carrying Capacity Assessment (Daya Dukung Daya Tampung Lingkungan Hidup DDDT-LH). The KLHS document, as mandated by Law Number 32/2009 on Environmental Protection and Management, is one of the prerequisites needed in preparing a medium-term development plan (Rencana Pembangunan Jangka Menengah Daerah RPJMD) at the provincial and district levels and ensures that regional development is environmentally sustainable. In 2018, we completed the DDDT analysis and the draft of KLHS and RPPLH. In 2019, the KLHS and RPPLH document for Seruyan District will be submitted for approval by the Head of District through a Head of District Decree. Seruyan District is the first district in Indonesia to implement all of these instruments and is an important pilot district for the Ministry of Environment and Forestry.
- 3. We supported the Ministry of Agriculture to develop an online platform for the smallholders to obtain cultivation registration letters (Surat Tanda Daftar Budidaya Usaha Perkebunan or STDB). These letters are required for certification under RSPO and ISPO. The Ministry of Agriculture launched the online platform in December 2018, namely e-STDB. The e-STDB system provides local governments with a simplified database of farmers,Äô plots, socioeconomic data and registrations. Through the platform, STDB can be issued electronically, where farmers can apply directly for a STDB through a dedicated website. STDB are a requirement for smallholders to achieve RSPO certification and the system simplifies the process for farmers to receive these documents.
- 4. A pilot initiative for implementing FPIC at the jurisdictional (district) level to resolve land conflicts has been launched. The FPIC mechanism will include a standard operating procedure for preventing and mediating conflicts, which will be supported by a district regulation and tied to the plantation monitoring system. The design is currently being discussed with the relevant non-government organizations, including the Forest Peoples Programme (FPP). This initiative is the first of its kind that we are aware of in Indonesia.
- 5. A field visit to Sabah was carried out in November 7-15, 2018. Approximately 18 smallholders from Seruyan participated in the field trip. The participants visited four districts in Sabah, including: (1) Telupid; (2) Beluran; (3) Kinabatangan; and (4) Kundasang. Through the field visit, Seruyan,Äôs smallholders exchanged experiences and information about process of smallholder certification in each district. - 6. In November 2018, following the field visit described above, INOBU supported the smallholders from Seruyan District to participate in the 16th RSPO Roundtable in Kota Kinabalu, Sabah, Malaysia. INOBU also supported the Head of Seruyan District, Mr. Yulhaidir, to present about the work for jurisdictional sustainability in Seruyan District, focusing on jurisdictional certification, in the session titled ,ÄúJurisdictional approaches: delivering sustainable and deforestation-free palm oil,Äù.
