	Established in 2012, the group scheme is now operational in Malaysia (Peninsular Malaysia and Sabah) and currently covers 278 farmers producing an estimated 3,089 tonnes of CPO. WAGS is actively seeking new partners to establish pilot projects in other palm producing countries and to work with existing RSPO- certified mills to extend their certification scope to small farmers.
