Status of key deliverables

 - To address the **losses** in the supply chain: Certification Unit will work on providing the following data:

 - list of certified KCP with unsold CSPKO,
 - list of certified ISH unsold CSPKO, and
 - spatial mapping Certified Mill KCP.

MT division to develop an outreach and engagement plan with these identified actors.

 - provide a list of uncertified KCP.
 - monitor the RaCP processes (cases to be closed soon) and
 - assess which mills with approved Concept Note have not gone for certification yet, and which ones will get the Concept Note accepted soon.

• Uptake targets Y4 endorsed - Next steps

- Uptake targets are applicable to <u>new</u> Ordinary members (joining from <u>Sept 2023</u> onwards) from the starting point of membership. These members will be assessed on their uptake target performance assessed on their first mandatory ACOP.
- Outreach underperformed members to incentivize ISH Credits.


CSPO mapping exercise:

- Certification to provide the data of the geographical distribution of CSPO sales (done by certified mills) vs Actual Production (i.e. identification of unsold volume), and
- the geographical distribution of CSPO purchases (done by 1st buyer) vs actual production volume- map of unpurchased V.
- SR Unit to present the data to the SRWG and follow up on any actions.

It was explained that for both the CSPKO and CSPO exercises, the SR Unit/SRWG will play the role of internal coordinator, as the first step is to get the data. The body to make the decisions is still to be decided, most probably the SCTWG.

It was recommended by the WG to invite commercial brands to understand their models and use their expertise.
