- Co-chair urged more active participation from members in the Sub Groups based on the topics of interest, as most of the work carried out are within the Sub Groups, especially from new members who have particular knowledge and experience
- Point raised on difficulty in LATAM on difficulty between HCV and HCS integration, particularly the social component. The difficulties lead to the HCVR Network that run assessments, unable to complete assessments.
 Many companies are facing this problem.
- NDTF Task Force tasked to look into HCV-HCS integration. There are new inputs from FPIC and more clarity will be obtained when FPIC is revised. In HCSA, ICLUP will be part of the integrated management plan under HCV. Social elements will also be a part of ICLUP.
- The Secretariat will also have to check alignment and cohesiveness between all the RSPO documents, including factoring in the HCV- HCSA approach, and the FPIC Sub Group to provide oversight on this
