<p>1. Opening Remarks by Chairperson</p> <p>The Chair opened the meeting by welcoming everybody and then invited everyone to scrutinize the minutes of the previous meeting.</p>
<p>2. “No Conflict of Interest”</p> <p>Two members had a conflict of interest in 3 of the cases/complaints being reported or deliberated. They will abstain from taking part in the deliberation and decision in those cases.</p>
<p>3. Minutes of the meeting of 17 December 2015</p> <p>The minutes of the meeting were adopted and confirmed by the members unanimously.</p>
<p>4. New Reported Cases</p> <p>The following are reported cases received by the RSPO Secretariat which have not yet been deliberated by the Complaints Panel.</p> <p>1. Plantaciones de Pucallpa SAC, Peru – lodged by FPP on 5 December 2015</p> <p>Plantaciones de Pucallpa SAC has been accused of human rights violation by the Shipibo community of Santa Clara de Uchunya. In so doing, Plantaciones de Pucallpa has been alleged to have breached the Principles and Criteria of the RSPO on land acquisition and the conservation of forest.</p> <p>Status: Box B. Complaint categorised</p> <p>Update: The RSPO Secretariat to further scrutinise the documents before any preliminary decision is made.</p> <p>2. RSPO (as an organization) – lodge by Sawit Watch on 4 December 2015</p> <p>Sawit Watch is observing the fire hotspots in several provinces in Indonesia using Monthly Hotspots data in 6 provinces issued by the Indonesia Ministry of Environment and Forestry. Sawit Watch did ground checks to make sure the locations that were mentioned by the satellite were verified. From direct observation, it is proven that for several hotspots, fires are indeed spreading in the oil palm concessions owned by RSPO members. The sample of the hotspots were given for locations in Jambi and Central Kalimantan.</p> <p>Sawit Watch has submitted their complaint to RSPO (as an organization) and requested the RSPO to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Implement a compliance audit process and overall verification for all RSPO member companies; 2) Implement RSPO certification review of the companies that have been proven to have burnt areas, including the whole supply chain; 3) Ensure that the companies implement continuous improvement through internal rules related to the land governance, fire mitigation, and apply best practices in palm oil management and production; 4) Ensure that all complaints and objections raised by complainants are processed in a transparent and accountable manner <p>Status: Box A. Complaint received</p> <p>Update: RSPO Secretariat had a conference call on 11 December 2015. Sawit Watch to provide detailed information including the GPS coordinates of the hotspots. Jakarta where it was determined if Sawit Watch were proceeding with the complaint, in view of the inherent difficulties for the RSPO to hear a complaint against itself. Sawit watch to give their feedback on the alternative ways to file the complaints against RSPO.

3. PT Agro Palindo Sakti, PT Buluh Cawang Plantation, PT Tania Selatan, PT Musi Banyuasin Indah subsidiaries of Wilmar International Ltd – 6 November 2015

The complaint is about termination of 13 labours.

Status: Box B. Complaint categorized

RSPO Secretariat had a meeting with Wilmar during RT 13 on 17 November 2015. Their justifications to terminate the staff are:

- ✓ Going on strike many times and without proper notification as required under the law.
- ✓ The staff also broke the collective bargaining agreement which they themselves agreed on with the company.
- ✓ The substance of the strikes is not related to Wilmar, it was against PT Sampoerna Agro. Wilmar is upset because the labourers in Wilmar went on strike for 3 days, while in Sampoerna Agro it was only for 1 day. Also because Wilmar is a buyer of Sampoerna Agro products, this strikes set a bad precedent. Wilmar said that they allow freedom of association to join the union. The union “Sekar” was established some years ago. Wilmar also give the staff leave to attend to union activities e.g. workshop in Jakarta. Wilmar is also supporting some funding for the union. Wilmar will reply to the complainant’s letter to RSPO soon.

Update: Mediation between the parties was held on 18 January 2016. The Secretariat is waiting for the updates from Wilmar on the results of mediation.

4. PT Bumitama Gunajaya Abadi / PT Bumitama – lodged by Sawit Watch on 13 November 2015

The case was lodged by Sawit Watch on 13 November 2015. The allegations are:

- Destroying graves and planting trees surrounding the graves;
- Dispute on plasma scheme mechanism;
- Termination of labourers and the status of labourers i.e. are they casual or permanent
- Compensation not paid directly to the land owner;
- Unauthorized use of trans-migrant land and the loss of land certificate;
- Criminalisation of Gusti Gelombang, a former Company Public Relation officer and now the Head of Cooperative Body.

This case has been handled bilaterally since 2014. It was escalated to RSPO because police came to Sawit Watch’s office to arrest Gusti Gelombang, who was in their office.

Status: Box A. Complaints Received

Update: The RSPO Secretariat to request the member to send their formal reply.

5. Extractora La Gloria SAS – Colombia - received 19 November 2015

The complaint is lodged by Fredy Antonio Corrales, representative of the Colombian Association for Displaced Peoples' Prospects (ASOCOL), Adelfo Segundo Rodríguez, representative of the Association of Returning Displaced Farmers (ASOCADAR), Senator Iván Cepeda, Senator Alberto Castilla, and Representative Alirio Uribe

The substance of the complaint is Extractora La Gloria SAS, in planting palm oil in the former Hacienda Bellacruz- today Hacienda La Gloria- occupies 9,000 hectares in the municipalities of La Gloria, Pelaya and Tamalameque, in southern Cesar Department without following RSPO rules. It does not comply with the following RSPO principles:

- Principle 1.1. The company does not provide clear and sufficient information regarding the Business Group.
- Principle 2.1. The Business Group has not declared itself to the Colombian authorities and the crops were planted without an Environmental Management Plan for the Forest Reserve, which goes against national business and environmental regulations.
- Principle 2.2. Property ownership claims in the areas where Extractora La Gloria grows the majority of its crops have been called into question by national and international judicial bodies. Farming communities have demanded the formalization of their customary land rights, which were violently denied by paramilitary groups.
- Principle 2.3. Business operations have not recognized the rights of farmers who are also displacement victims, in contravention of businesses' duty to guarantee free, prior and informed consent regarding land use.
- Principle 4.4. While installing and processing palm crops, Extractora La Gloria adversely affected the Caño Alonso Forest Reserve Buffer Zone and the Singararé, El Carmen and Simaña streams.
- Principle 5.2. The company has not avoided damaging the Caño Alonso Forest Reserve Buffer Zone, a specially protected habitat by planting palm crops over the Reserve's environmental buffer zone.
- Principle 6.4. The company has neglected the claimants, despite the fact that they have been the most affected by its business activities. The company has also refused to create negotiation platforms.
- Principle 6.13. The company has benefited from grave human rights violations of vulnerable farmers, who were also forcefully displaced by illegal armed persons. The company has not publicly denied that it has used the threats and intimidations against the claimants. It even requested that the Constitutional Court lift the cautionary measures protecting the victims.

Status: Box B – Complaint categorised

Update: The RSPO Secretariat has received clarifications from the company on 5 Dec 2015. However, it needs further investigation. The RSPO Secretariat shall advise the Panel at the next meeting.

6. Hap Seng Plantations Holdings Bhd, complaint filed by Sia Yi Chin of Lahad Datu Sabah on 11 November 2015

The complainant is claiming that Hap Seng Plantations Holdings Bhd is illegally occupying his property (River Estates) of 6,454 acres in Lahad Datu, Sabah. He says that he is the beneficial owner of the said land and the land office in Kota Kinabalu has confirmed that the said land is still in his name as beneficial owner. He has filed a civil suit against Hap Seng; originating summons: BKI-24-127/5 of 2012 filed on 30.07.2015.

Status: Box A. Complaint Received

Update: The company has replied to the RSPO Secretariat, stating that the matter is published in the Annual report (Page 106/107) and the matter is now in the courts of law.

The complainant has been informed on 5 January 2016.

The Complaints Panel looks forward to further updates of the case at the next meeting.

7. PT Ecogreen Oleochemical (processor) – lodged by Serikat Pekerja Kimia, Energi dan Pertambangan SPSP (Indonesia Labour Union) on 26 October 2015

The company has terminated 50 workers on grounds of increasing efficiency.

Status: Box H. Closed – 12 January 2016.

Update: The member has sent their formal reply on 11 December 2015, saying that the case has been resolved. The RSPO Secretariat will send a formal closure letter.

8. PT Telaga Hikmah I/Sampoerna Agro – 16 September 2015

The complaint was lodged by the labour union, KASBI. The allegations are :

- 1) no freedom to be a member of KASBI (trade union), as there were incidences of intimidation such as transfer and termination of the staff who are involved in KASBI;
- 2) the company has breached Labour Law by employing daily workers for more than 21 days and did not promote them as fixed term employees;
- 3) The company has ‘pushed’ the employees to be members of Serikat Pekerja Sampoerna Agro (SPSA) the union with majority members;
- 4) The termination of Mr. Mugiyanto was unfair.

Mr. Mugiyanto was terminated because he had harvested unripe FFB three times, but on the other hand, other employees who did the same during the low crop season were not hauled up by the company.

Status : Box G. Closed for monitoring – 7 November 2015

Update: The complaint has been settled by tripartite discussion on 3 December 2015. The agreement is that the issue will be discussed bilaterally without any complaints against PT Sampoerna Agro. The RSPO Secretariat sent a letter to KASBI on 4th of December 2015 informing them on the progress of the case. PT Sampoerna Agro has sent the progress update to RSPO on 7 December 2015.

9. Poligrow Italy/ Poligrow Colombia Ltda – 13 August 2015

EIA’s video, “Between Water and Oil Palm,” is a collaboration with Colombian group La Comisión Intereclesial de Justicia y Paz (Justicia y Paz) and has documented how investments have come at the expense of indigenous rights in Mapiripán, Meta, Colombia. One company, the Italian-owned Poligrow Ltd, has prohibited the Jiw and Sikuani indigenous communities from using traditional hunting and fishing lands, and prevented access to a culturally revered site, Las Toninas—a lake considered sacred and home to pink dolphins. The Jiw report that no free, prior, or informed consultation has taken place regarding Poligrow’s operations and that the company’s expansion limits their right to freedom of movement. The video above alleged abuses by RSPO Italian member in Colombia.

Status : Box B. Complaint Categorised

Update: The Complaints Panel decided that the case should be investigated by an independent third party. The company have agreed to the investigation plan. RSPO Secretariat is currently developing the Terms of Reference (ToR). The Complaints Panel agreed to move this case into Group 3.

Update: First Resources had a meeting with Link-Ar during RT 13. The RSPO to monitor the agreement that had been signed on 31 July 2015 in handling land burning and land clearing issues.

The RSPO Secretariat shall wait for First Resources to send the details of the meeting.

6.2 General Information

- i. The minutes of the 17 December 2015 meeting will be published on the RSPO website on 22 January 2016.
- ii. RSPO will organize a Half Day Mediation Seminar in Jakarta with Pusat Mediasi Nasional on 26 January 2016.
- iii. The abstract of the paper, entitled “Environmental and Conflict Resolution: Case Study of Dispute Settlement Facility (DSF) in RSPO” was accepted. The paper will be presented in Lombok during the 7th Asia Pacific Mediation Forum on 10-12 Feb 2016.

6.3 Complaints System Revamp

- i. Starting 11 Jan 2016 ASI is going to review the Integrated Complaints System (ICS) Procedure doc together with the 9 comments (including 1 from ASI) received during the public consultation in Oct-Nov 2015. ASI will submit a concise draft on 10 Feb 2016, and the Secretariat will give inputs before it is put for 60 days public consultation.

6.4 Membership of Complaints Panel

- i. Lanash Tandha (LT) from Sabah Environmental Protection Association (SEPA) will be joining the Complaints Panel as an observer.

7. FELDA Global Ventures – Article by Wall Street Journal 26 July 2015

- i. Wall Street Journal published an article on migrant worker abuses in the Malaysian oil palm plantation industry on 26 July 2015.
- ii. On 29 July 2015, 12 NGOs urged the RSPO to conduct a transparent investigation into Wall Street Journal’s findings of forced labour, human trafficking, and other human and labour rights violations especially on RSPO member FELDA’s plantations.
- iii. RSPO Secretariat has conducted an independent assessment to investigate the report on the efficacy of CB reports on labour condition on all RSPO members. Malaysia is the first country, to be assessed.

- iv. ASI has conducted two investigation audits on FELDA: 1) investigation audit on Certification Bodies, Mutu Agung Lestari and Control Union; 2) investigation audit on FELDA, highlighting the issues raised by Wall Street Journal article.
- v. Regarding the status of the compliance audit against the CBs, ASI has raised two non-compliance issues. The CBs will be given 3 months period to close the major issues raised.
- vi. As the next step, RSPO will conduct an integrity audit on RSPO certified members in Malaysia highlighting the issues raised by Wall Street Journal. This was scheduled for November/December, 2015.
- vii. RSPO Secretariat has circulated the report from ASI to the Complaints Panel members and has received their comments on the matter. Secretariat will work with the Technical Department to address the issues raised by Complaints Panel and update on the next steps at the next meeting.
- viii. The Complaints Panel has conveyed their concerns regarding the ASI's report and expected responses from ASI on the matter. RSPO Secretariat will discuss this with the Technical Department of RSPO.
- ix. The internal meeting between Impacts and Technical was held and an agreed action plan was devised. The subsequent letter was drafted and shared with Complaints Panel members on 13th of January 2016.

8. Golden Veroleum Liberia

- i. During the meeting, of 4th June 2015, it was decided that the 'Butaw incident' will be treated as a separate issue from the main complaint.
- ii. A meeting took place on 5 August 2015, and the next meeting was scheduled on 24th August 2015.
- iii. The Panel stressed the need to reach a balanced decision to address all the issues leading to an amicable solution to multiple issues.
- iv. The Impacts Team has sent out emails to stakeholders on the meeting in Liberia in September 2015 on the establishment of a pilot initiative for a National Advisory Committee on Oil Palm in Liberia.
- v. On 26th September 2015, the Impacts Team presented the decision of the Complaints Panel to the stakeholders in Monrovia, Liberia.
- vi. On 26 October 2015, GVL sent their response to the decision of the CP dated 19 September 2015.
- vii. On 16 November, the Complaints Panel decided that the 'stop work order' may be lifted after GVL renegotiate the FPIC from the communities in Butaw.
- viii. 8 December 2015, GVL asked for a lifting of the Stop Work Order, as they claimed it was at the request of the community. The RSPO Secretariat to draft the letter and circulate it to the Complaints Panel members for review.
- ix. The letter was sent to GVL on 21 Dec 2015 and conditions for the lifting of the "stop work order" were specified in it.
- x. We are waiting for the response from the complainants.
