Agenda item

1. Opening Remarks by Chairperson

The Chair opened the meeting by welcoming everybody and then invited everyone to scrutinize the minutes of the previous meeting.

2. "No Conflict of Interest"

None of the members had a conflict of interest in any of the case/complaints being reported or deliberated.

3. Minutes of the meeting of 21 October 2015

The minutes of the meeting were adopted and confirmed by the members unanimously.

4. New Reported Cases

The following are reported cases received by the RSPO Secretariat which have not yet been deliberated by the Complaints Panel.

1. Plantaciones de Pucallpa SAC - Peru

Plantaciones de Pucallpa SAC has been accused of human rights violation by the Shipibo community of Santa Clara de Uchunya. In so doing, Plantaciones de Pucallpa has been alleged to have breached the Principles and Criteria of the RSPO on land acquisition and the conservation of forest. These allegations were made in a forum in London; please see the link below.

Status: Box A. Complaint received

Update: RSPO Secretariat has written to the company on the 4th of November 2015 and sought clarification.

2. PT Ecogreen Oleochemical (processor) – lodge by Serikat Pekerja Kimia, Energi dan Pertambangan SPSI (Indonesia Labour Union) on 26 October 2015

The company has terminated 50 workers with the reason to increase efficiency.

Status: Box A. Complaint received.

Update: RSPO Secretariat has sent an email to the company on 27th of October 2015 and is currently waiting for their reply.

3. PT Sarana Esa Cipta & PT Mulia Indah (Musim Mas) – lodge by farmers Group of Usaha Mandiri Prima on 27 October 2015.

It is alleged that the company has grabbed land owned by the Farmers Group of Usaha Mandiri Prima of 272 Hectares.

Status: Box A. Complaint received.

Update: RSPO secretariat had a meeting with Musim Mas on 11 November 2015. The company has strong evidence to show that they have already paid for the compensation. The land does not belong to the farmers group but owned by Raden Farid Muchsin Panji Anom (Royal Family of Sambas Kingdom). The reference letter

tendered as the evidence from the complainant is no longer valid, because the Head of Village has issued a letter saying that the land is owned by Farid Muchsin. The case will be closed by the end of November 2015.

4. PT Sintang Raya/Miwon Commercial Co. Ltd - 6 October 2015

Complaints was lodged by NGO, Link-Ar Borneo on behalf of indigenous community of Pelita Jaya, Olak-olak Kubu, Dabong, Mengkalan, Seruat I, Seruat II, and Ambawang Village which located in Kubu, Kubu Raya, West Kalimantan. The allegations are:

- 1) The company is operating without plantation business permit (HGU). The Supreme Court has canceled the HGU permit of PT Sintang Raya in 2013 (decision No 550 K/TUN/2013);
- 2) The land acquisition is only based on the letter of release from the Head of Village in 2008, instead of getting the consent of the indigenous community.

Status: Box J. No case

Update: on 20 October, PT Sintang Raya sent their clarification. The company does not have any links with Miwon Commercial Co. Ltd. This statement had been confirmed via phone with the parties. The RSPO Secretariat considers that there is no case, since it involves a non-member.

No further action and it is up to Wilmar to address the issues raised.

5. PT Karya Makmur Langgeng/Bumitama Agri Ltd – 26 September 2015

The complaint was lodged by NGO, LinK-Ar Borneo on behalf of the indigenous villagers of Keklipor and Paoh Concong, Simpang Hulu Sub district, Ketapang, West Kalimantan. Allegations:

- 1) no clear information on the total sum of compensation paid for destroyed crops on the indigenous land of Keklipor;
- 2) No clear information on the plasma scheme for small holder;
- 3) PT.KML said that they hold the HGU permit issued by the government of Indonesia, but on the dissemination (socialization) process , PT.KML did not show the document(permit), so the community has doubts about the company's permit;
- 4) There is intimidation during the dissemination(socialization) process and post-dissemination process which was done by the local government of Simpang Hulu sub-district;
- 5) There is an illegal compensation given by the PT.KML to the head of Paoh Concong village and some of the customary leaders of about Rp. 600.000 /month.

Status: Box B. Complaint Categorized

Update: Bumitama have sent their formal response on 9 October 2015 clarifying the allegations. Bumitama had a meeting with the community on 20 October 2015. Based on information from community members, the complainant has falsified the letter of objection. The attached signatures on the letter belongs to a different meeting on customary land.

The RSPO Secretariat has sent a strong email to the complainant on the need for integrity in filing complaints. We will continue to monitor bilateral cooperation between parties.

6. PT Telaga Hikmah I/Sampoerna Agro – 16 September 2015

The complaint was lodged by the labour union, KASBI. The allegations are:

- 1) no freedom to be a member of KASBI (trade union), as there were intimidation such as transfer and termination of the staff who are involved in KASBI;
- 2) the company has breached Labour Law by employing daily workers for more than 21 days and did not promote them as fixed term employees;
- 3) The company has 'pushed' the employees to be members of Serikat Pekerja Sampoerna Agro (SPSA) the union with the majority of members
- 4) The termination of Mr. Mugiyanto was unfair.

Mr. Mugiyanto was terminated with the reason, that he had harvested young FFB three times, but on the other hand, other employees who did the same during the low crop season were not hauled up by the company.

Status: Box B. Complaint Categorized

Update: on 4 November 2015, Secretariat met the CEO of Sampoerna Agro and 2 Directors. They revealed that they have taken part in bipartite and tripartite negotiations facilitated by the government. The District Manpower Office (Dinas Tenaga Kerja) has invited Mugiyanto for further meetings.

RSPO Secretariat to monitor the outcome. The case will remain as a reported case until the outcome is known.

7. Poligrow Italy/ Poligrow Colombia Itda – 13 August 2015

EIA's video, "Between Water and Oil Palm," is a collaboration with Colombian group La Comisión Intereclesial de Justicia y Paz (Justicia y Paz) and has documented how investments have come at the expense of indigenous rights in Mapiripán, Meta, Colombia. One company, the Italian-owned Poligrow Ltd, has prohibited the Jiw and Sikuani indigenous communities from using traditional hunting and fishing lands, and prevented access to a culturally revered site, Las Toninas—a lake considered sacred and home to pink dolphins. The Jiw report that no free, prior, or informed consultation has taken place regarding Poligrow's operations and that the company's expansion, limits their right to freedom of movement. The video above alleged abuses by RSPO Italian member in Colombia.

Status: Box A. Complaint Received

Update: The RSPO Secretariat has written to them asking for clarification. The member responded on 25th of August 2015 and the Secretariat followed it up with a teleconference on 2 September 2015. On 16 September 2015, EIA USA wrote to RSPO saying that they are still evaluation RSPO complaint process.

Complaint Panel decided that the case should be investigated by an independent third party. The company have agreed to the investigation plan. RSPO Secretariat to develop the Terms of Reference (ToR) for the investigation.

8. PT Harapan Hibrida Kalbar, Lipat Gunting Estate (Manis Mata, District Ketapang, West Kalimantan, Indonesia) a subsidiary of PT Union Sampoerna Triputra Persada – lodged by Padma Indonesia on 26 May 2015.

The Human Rights Commission of Indonesia (Komnas HAM) and the Ombudsman (Ombudsman Republik Indonesia) are also involved.

The letter from Komnas HAM to the Head of the District of Ketapang dated 10 September 2014, states that there is wide spread land grabbing of about 1,588 hectares that is owned by 330 families (Kepala Keluarga/KK). The letter from the Ombudsman Republik Indonesia Perwakilan Kalimantan Barat to the Head of the District of Ketapang dated 10 March 2014, revealed that the complaint is related to the absence of implementation of planting under the Kredit Koperasi Primer Anggota (KKPA) scheme since 2006 until present.

Status: Box A. Complaint Received

Update: On 5 October 2015 Triputra Agro Persada has replied to the Secretariat, saying that PT HHK is not a RSPO member. However, we asked them to issue a formal letter stating that PT HHK is not their subsidiary and is not in their supply chain. We are looking forward to receiving the letter and meeting them on the 19th November 2015. The Secretariat to check if they have management control over the company, which might make them subject to RSPO rules.

9. PT Swadaya Multi Prakarsa (Batu Daya Village, Simpang Dua, Ketapang, West Kalimantan, Indonesia) a subsidiary of First Resources – lodged by Link-Ar Borneo on 11 May 2015.

The allegations are:

- i. land clearing and plantation activities without Plantation Business Permit (IUP);
- ii. land clearing by burning;
- iii. land claim by community of Batu Daya including the plasma;
- iv. lack of FPIC.

Status: Box F. Action Plan

Update: There was an incident on the field, where one of the LinK-Ar staff was punched by a community member. Currently, it is still under investigation by the company. Secretariat will monitor the incident and the implementation of the action plan.

7.FELDA Global Ventures - Article by Wall Street Journal 26 July 2015

- i. Wall Street Journal published an article on migrant worker abuses in the Malaysian oil palm plantation industry on 26 July 2015.
- ii. On 29 July 2015, 12 NGOs urged the RSPO to conduct a transparent investigation into Wall Street Journal's findings of forced labour, human trafficking, and other human and labour rights violations especially on RSPO member FELDA's plantations.
- iii. RSPO Secretariat will conduct an independent assessment to investigate the report on the efficacy of CB reports on labour condition on all RSPO members. Malaysia would be the first country, where the assessment would be done.
- iv. ASI has conducted two investigation audits on FELDA: 1) investigation audit on Certification Bodies, Mutu Agung Lestari and Control Union; 2) investigation audit on FELDA, highlighting the issues raised by Wall Street Journal article.
- v. Regarding the status of compliance audit against the CBs, ASI has raised two non-compliances issues. The CBs will be given 3 months period to close the major issues raised.
- vi. As the next step, RSPO will conduct an integrity audit on industries in Malaysia highlighting the issues raised by Wall Street Journal, this would be conducted most likely in November/December.
- vii. RSPO Secretariat has circulated the report from ASI to the Complaints Panel members and has received the comments on the matter. Secretariat shall work with the Technical Department to address the issues raised by Complaints Panel and update on the next steps at the next meeting.

8. Golden Veroleum Liberia

- i. During the meeting, of 4th June 2015, it was decided that the '<u>Butaw incident'</u> will be treated as a separate issue from the main complaint.
- ii. A meeting took place on 5 August 2015, and the next meeting is scheduled on 24th August 2015.
- iii. The Panel stressed the need to reach a balanced decision to address all the issues leading to an amicable solution to multiple issues.
- iv. The Impacts Team has sent out emails to stakeholders on the meeting in Liberia in September 2015, on the establishment of a pilot initiative for a National Advisory Committee on Oil Palm in Liberia.
- v. On 26th of September 2015, the Impacts Team presented the decision of the Complaints Panel to the stakeholders in Monrovia Liberia.
- vi. On 26 October 2015, GVL sent their response to the decision of the CP dated 19 September 2015.
- vii. On 16 November, Complaints Panel has decided that the 'stop work order' may be lifted after GVL renegotiate the FPIC from the communities in Butaw and sign a permanent MOU.
