#### Agenda item

#### 1. Opening Remarks by Chairperson

The Chair opened the meeting by welcoming everybody and then invited everyone to scrutinize the minutes of the previous meeting.

#### 2. "No Conflict of Interest"

Two members had a conflict of interest in 3 of the cases/complaints being reported or deliberated. They will abstain from taking part in the deliberation and decision in those cases.

#### 3. Minutes of the meeting of 21 January 2016

The minutes of the meeting were adopted and confirmed by the members unanimously.

#### 4. New Reported Cases

The following are reported cases received by the RSPO Secretariat which have not yet been deliberated by the Complaints Panel.

#### IOI – filed by Puan Merysah Sevilla, a villager in Ulu Estate on 11 January 2016

RSPO Secretariat received a phone call from a villager in Ulu Estate in the first week of January 2016. The villager complained that the IOI management in the estate demolished their houses which were being built in the riparian reserve of Sg Tungud in the estate. The houses are being shifted from the original locations due to flooding. She said that the villagers have applied for permission from the state government to build the houses.

Status: Box A - Reported case received

**Update**: IOI has sent their clarification on 22 January 2016, stating that the company had not demolished any structure. They had informed her on 21 Nov 2015 that a house cannot be constructed at that location and advised the complainant to dismantle and move. The company have also sent several letters to the complainant to highlight this matter.

This case has been officially addressed by the company in December 2015. RSPO Secretariat will send a letter to the villager stating that a house cannot be constructed at that place. It is suggested that this case can be closed.

#### 2. Musim Mas – lodged by Walhi Jambi on 15 February 2016

Musim Mas buys FFB from PT Bukit Bintang Sawit (PT BBS) which is non RSPO member. PT BBS has a land dispute with the communities in 3 villages, namely Desa Seponjen, Sogo dan Tanjung in District Muaro Jambi, Indonesia.

Status: Box A - reported case received

**Update**: the complainant asked RSPO to be an observer during the mediation that will be held on 2 March 2016 in Jambi

The Complaint Panel was of the view that the complaint is technically invalid as PT BBS is not a member of RSPO. Based on this, the Complaints Panel advised RSPO to not attend the mediation. However, the Panel agreed to request PT Musim Mas, as one of PT BBS's supply chain, to attend the meeting as an observer.

# 3. PT Ecogreen Oleochemical (processors) – lodged by Serikat Pekerja Kimia, Energi dan Pertambangan SPSI (Indonesia Labour Union) on 26 October 2015

The company has terminated 50 workers giving reasons, to increase efficiency.

The company and the workers have signed an agreement, where they have been compensated.

Status: Box H. Case Closed

**Update**: Box H. Case Closed – 9 February 2016 Closure letter has been sent to the company.

#### 4. RSPO (as an organization) – lodge by Sawit Watch on 4 December 2015

Sawit Watch is observing the fire hotspots in several provinces in Indonesia using Monthly Hotspots data in 6 provinces issued by the Indonesia Ministry of Environment and Forestry. Sawit Watch did ground checks to make sure the locations that were mentioned by the satellite were verified. From direct observation, it is proven that for several hotspots, fires are indeed spreading in the oil palm concessions owned by RSPO members. The sample of the hotspots were given for locations in Jambi and Central Kalimantan.

Sawit Watch has submitted their complaint to RSPO (as an organization) and requested the RSPO to:

- Implement a compliance audit process and overall verification for all RSPO member companies;
- Implement RSPO certification review of the companies that have been proven to have burnt areas, including the whole supply chain;
- Ensure that the companies implement continuous improvement through internal rules related to the land governance, fire mitigation, and apply best practices in palm oil management and production;
- Ensure that all complaints and objections raised by complainants are processed in a transparent and accountable manner

Status: Box A. Complaint received

**Update**: RSPO Secretariat had meeting with Sawit Watch on 13 January 2016. We suggested 3 options: 1) the case is lodged to BoG; 2) submit to ISEAL; 3) Focus to 1-2 members. No response yet from Sawit Watch since the meeting.

# 5. PT Agro Palindo Sakti, PT Buluh Cawang Plantation, PT Tania Selatan, PT Musi Banyuasin Indah subsidiaries of Wilmar International Ltd – 6 November 2015

The complaint is about the termination of 13 labourers.

Status: Box B. Complaint categorized

RSPO Secretariat had a meeting with Wilmar during RT 13 on 17 November 2015. Their justifications to terminate the staff are:

- Going on strike many times and without proper notification as required under the law.
- The staff also broke the collective bargaining agreement which they themselves agreed on with the company.
- The substance of the strikes is not related to Wilmar, it was against PT Sampoerna Agro. Wilmar is upset because the labourers in Wilmar went on strike for 3 days, while in Sampoerna Agro it was only for 1 day. Also because Wilmar is a buyer of Sampoerna Agro products, this strikes set a bad precedent. Wilmar said that they allow freedom of association to join the union. The union "Sekar" was established some years ago. Wilmar also gave the staff leave to attend to union activities e.g. workshop in Jakarta. Wilmar is also supporting some funding for the union. Wilmar will reply to the complainant's letter to RSPO soon.

**Update**: No consensus was reached in the 2nd mediation on 18 January 2016, there were a further meeting on 26 Jan 2016, which again yielded no common consent. Wilmar received a letter from Disnaker on 11 February 2016, which has concluded that the workers' demonstration on 15 October had violated the law PKB, Pasal 5(1), Pasal 47 (1c, 2b). Disnaker has recommended compensation packages to the workers. Wilmar is currently reviewing the recommendation and will respond within 10 days.

#### 6. PT Bumitama Gunajaya Abadi / PT Bumitama – lodged by Sawit Watch on 13 November 2015

The case was lodged by Sawit Watch on 13 November 2015.

The allegations are:

- Destroying graves and planting trees around the graves;
- Dispute on plasma scheme mechanism;
- Termination of labourers and the status of labourers i.e. are they casual or permanent
- Compensation not paid directly to the land owners;
- Unauthorized use of trans-migrant land and the loss of land certificate;
- Criminalisation of Gusti Gelombang, a former Company Public Relation officer and now the Head of the Cooperative .

This case has been handled bilaterally since 2014. It was escalated to RSPO because police came to Sawit Watch's office to arrest Gusti Gelombang, who was in their office at the time.

Update: RSPO Secretariat had a meeting with the complainant on 23 February 2016. The complainant requested RSPO to facilitate the case rather than to continue with the bilateral engagement.

#### 7. Extractora La Gloria SAS – Colombia - received 19 November 2015

**The complaint is lodged by** Fredy Antonio Corrales, representative of the Colombian Association for Displaced Peoples' Prospects (ASOCOL), Adelfo Segundo Rodríguez, representative of the Association of Returning Displaced Farmers (ASOCADAR), Senator Iván Cepeda, Senator Alberto Castilla, and Representative Alirio Uribe

The substance of the complaint is Extractora La Gloria SAS, in planting palm oil in the former Hacienda Bellacruz- today Hacienda La Gloria- occupies 9,000 hectares in the municipalities of La Gloria, Pelaya and Tamalameque, in southern Cesar Department without following RSPO rules. It does not comply with the following RSPO principles:

- Principle 1.1. The company does not provide clear and sufficient information regarding the Business Group.
- Principle 2.1. The Business Group has not declared itself to the Colombian authorities and the crops were planted without an Environmental Management Plan for the Forest Reserve, which goes against national business and environmental regulations.
- Principle 2.2. Property ownership claims in the areas where Extractora La Gloria grows the majority of its crops have been called into question by national and international judicial bodies. Farming communities have demanded the formalization of their customary land rights, which were violently denied by paramilitary groups.
- Principle 2.3. Business operations have not recognized the rights of farmers who are also displacement victims, in contravention of businesses' duty to guarantee free, prior and informed consent regarding land use.
- Principle 4.4. While installing and processing palm crops, Extractora La Gloria adversely affected the Caño Alonso Forest Reserve Buffer Zone and the Singararé, El Carmen and Simaña streams.
- Principle 5.2. The company has not avoided damaging the Caño Alonso Forest Reserve Buffer Zone, a specially protected habitat by planting palm crops over the Reserve's environmental buffer zone.
- Principle 6.4. The company has neglected the claimants, despite the fact that they have been the most affected by its business activities. The company has also refused to create negotiation platforms.
- Principle 6.13. The company has benefited from grave human rights violations of vulnerable farmers, who were also forcefully displaced by illegal armed persons. The company has not publicly denied that it has used the threats and intimidations against the claimants. It even requested that the Constitutional Court lift the cautionary measures protecting the victims.

Status: Box B - Complaint categorised

**Update**: On 21 Dec 2015 The complainants responded and it was forwarded to the company. Subsequently, the company replied and now it is with the complainants once more (6 Jan 2016).

A teleconference has been scheduled with the complainant on 24 Feb 2016. Any decision will be made after

It is recommended that this case to be moved to Group 2.

### 8. Hap Seng Plantations Holdings Bhd, complaint filed by Sia Yi Chin of Lahad Datu Sabah on 11 November 2015

The complainant is claiming that Hap Seng Plantations Holdings Bhd is illegally occupying his property (River Estates) of 6,454 acres in Lahad Datu, Sabah. He says that he is the beneficial owner of the said land and the land office in Kota Kinabalu has confirmed that the said land is still in his name as beneficial owner. He has filed a civil suit against Hap Seng; originating summons: BKI-24-127/5 of 2012 filed on 30.07.2015.

Status: Box A. Complaint Received

**Update**: RSPO Secretariat has conveyed the response from the company to the Complainant. It was suggested to allow the civil proceedings to proceed.

9. PT Swadaya Multi Prakarsa (Batu Daya Village, Simpang Dua, Ketapang, West Kalimantan, Indonesia) a subsidiary of First Resources – lodged by Link-Ar Borneo on 11 May 2015.

The allegations are:

- land clearing and plantation activities without Plantation Permit (IUP);
- land clearing by burning;
- land claim by community of Batu Daya including the plasma;
- lack of FPIC.

Status: Box F. Action Plan

**Update**: The company are waiting for GPS coordinate information from NGO. NGO states that the community claimed the company had grabbed about 1000 ha of the community's land but has not yet provided the exact location.

#### **6.4 Membership of Complaints Panel**

i. Lanash Tandha (LT) from Sabah Environmental Protection Association (SEPA) is joining us as an observer. RSPO secretariat to look for a social NGO member from Indonesia to be a part of the Complaints Panel.

#### **6.5 Membership Suspension and Certification suspension**

- i. A suspension of membership should also involve suspension of all their certification.
   This was practiced during the suspension of members for late submission of ACOP.
- ii. We should be consistent throughout the organisation, membership as well as certification. Suspension should be considered very carefully as it involves financial implications on the member. Every member should understand the severity of the suspension.

#### 7. FELDA Global Ventures – Article by Wall Street Journal 26 July 2015

- i. Wall Street Journal published an article on migrant worker abuses in the Malaysian oil palm plantation industry on 26 July 2015.
- ii. On 29 July 2015, 12 NGOs urged the RSPO to conduct a transparent investigation into Wall Street Journal's findings of forced labour, human trafficking, and other human and labour rights violations especially on RSPO member FELDA's plantations.
- iii. RSPO Secretariat has conducted an independent assessment to investigate the report on the efficacy of CB reports on labour condition on all RSPO members. Malaysia is the first country, to be assessed.
- iv. ASI has conducted two investigation audits on FELDA: 1) investigation audit on Certification Bodies, Mutu Agung Lestari and Control Union; 2) investigation audit on FELDA, highlighting the issues raised by Wall Street Journal article.
- v. Regarding the status of the compliance audit against the CBs, ASI has raised two non-compliances issues. The CBs will be given 3 months period to close the major issues raised.
- vi. As the next step, RSPO will conduct an integrity audit on RSPO certified members in Malaysia highlighting the issues raised by Wall Street Journal. This was scheduled for November/December, 2015.
- vii. RSPO Secretariat has circulated the report from ASI to the Complaints Panel members and has received their comments on the matter. Secretariat will work with the Technical Department to address the issues raised by Complaints Panel and update on the next steps at the next meeting.
- viii. The Complaints Panel has conveyed their concerns regarding the ASI's report and expected responses from ASI on the matter. RSPO Secretariat will discuss this with the Technical Department of RSPO.
- ix. The internal meeting between Impacts and Technical was held and an agreed action plan was devised. The subsequent letter was drafted and shared with Complaints Panel members on 13<sup>th</sup> of January 2016.

- x. On 14 January 2016, ASI suspended two CBs Mutuagung Lestari and Control Union (Malaysia) SDN BHD found to be in violation of RSPO's certification system requirement.
- xi. It is agreed to move this case to Group 2.

#### 8. Golden Veroleum Liberia

- i. During the meeting, of 4<sup>th</sup> June 2015, it was decided that the '<u>Butaw incident'</u> will be treated as a separate issue from the main complaint.
- ii. A meeting took place on 5 August 2015, and the next meeting was scheduled on 24<sup>th</sup> August 2015.
- iii. The Panel stressed the need to reach a balanced decision to address all the issues leading to an amicable solution to multiple issues.
- iv. The Impacts Team has sent out emails to stakeholders on the meeting in Liberia in September 2015 on the establishment of a pilot initiative for a National Advisory Committee on Oil Palm in Liberia.
- v. On 26<sup>th</sup> September 2015, the Impacts Team presented the decision of the Complaints Panel to the stakeholders in Monrovia, Liberia.
- vi. On 26 October 2015, GVL sent their response to the decision of the CP dated 19 September 2015.
- vii. On 16 November, the Complaints Panel decided that the 'stop work order' may be lifted after GVL renegotiate the FPIC from the communities in Butaw.
- viii. 8 December 2015, GVL asked for a lifting of the Stop Work Order, as they claimed it was at the request of the community. The RSPO Secretariat to draft the letter and circulate it to the Complaints Panel members for review.
- ix. The letter was sent to GVL on 21 Dec 2015 and conditions for the lifting of the "stop work order" were specified in it.
- x. We are waiting for the response from the complainants.
- xi. RSPO secretariat received a response from 3 complainants NGO on their concern on the case. The meeting will be scheduled between RSPO Secretariat and Complaints panel on GVL issues on 21 March 2016.
