Agenda item

1. Opening Remarks by Chairperson

The Chair opened the meeting by welcoming everybody and then invited everyone to scrutinize the minutes of the previous meeting.

2. Minutes of the meeting of 17 February 2015

The minutes of the meeting were adopted and confirmed by the members unanimously.

3. New Complaints

1. Orang Dusun Lahad Datu/FELDA * - received on 16 February 2015

Dusun Bagahak community complained that FELDA has acquired their land including the cemetery area and plan to plant palm oil in that area. FELDA's stand is that an agreement was made, that 916 acres of land will be given to the community but now the community has taken over, 1260 acres of land despite the agreement. Also, FELDA installed dividers around the cemetery and will preserve that area. We have received some evidence from both sides. The evidence need to be scrutinised and investigated further by the Complaints Coordinator.

Status: Box A

2. PT Gunung Melayu (Asian Agri) – received on 2 March 2015

Kelompok Tani/Farmer Group Ujung Masehi alleged that PT Gunung Melayu has taken over their land (68 hectares) without compensation in Asahan, North Sumatra. The Secretariat is waiting for clarification from the member, PT Gunung Melayu.

Status: Box A

3. PT Nubika Jaya (Permata Hijau Group/PHG) -received on 16 February 2015

Masyarakat Peduli Lingkungan Hidup Labusel (MPLH) alleged that PT Nubika Jaya has polluted the waters of River Baba in Labuhan Batu Selatan, North Sumatra. The Secretariat is waiting for clarification from the member PHG. Update will be given on the next meeting. A dateline needs to be set regarding when the clarification will be received to make sure it is followed. It currently is not an official complaint until an official document is received.

Update: Had been settled bilaterally. Complainant will lodge formal complaint if PT Nubika Jaya breach the agreement.

4. PT Perkebunan Nusantara III (PTPN 3) - received on 26 January 2015

Masyarakat Peduli Lingkungan Hidup Labusel (MPLH), who represent Mr. Busu Rambe against PTPN 3, North Sumatra. The complaint is about the planting activity of PTPN 3 which has affected the small holding owned by Pak Busu Rambe (± 280 palm oil trees, 4 years old) a member of the local community. PTPN 3 activities is alleged to have caused soil erosion as a result of the company planting on steep slopes. The eroded soil that entered Mr. Busu Rambe's plantation land area has resulted in him not being able to harvest his crop.

Update: Has been resolved bilaterally. Secretariat to wait for a formal letter from the Complainant. Status: Box A

5. PT Barumun Agro Sentosa – received on 19 January 2015

The complaint is between Mr. Hepli Harahap and Haji Soleh Hasibuan against PT Barumun Agro Sentosa (PT BAS). The complaint is about land claim issues, located in Jambu Tonang village, Simangambat, Padang Lawas Utara district, Sumatera Utara, Indonesia. Secretariat are still awaiting further information.

Update: Secretariat had a conference call meeting with complainant and PT BAS. The Secretariat shall review all the documents that has been submitted by both sides. In the next meeting, further development will be shared.

6. PT Unggul Lestari - received on 23 January 2015

Kelompok Tani/ Community Group Bhakti Karya in Bukit Indah village, sub district Telaga Antang, District (Kabupaten) Kotawaringin Timur, Central Kalimantan Province, against PT Unggul Lestari. The complaint is about a land claim, 685 hectares. Kelompok and Bhakti Karya allege that PT Unggul Lestari has taken their land and planted on it without their permission.

Update: Secretariat to review all the documents that had been submitted by both sides. In the next meeting, the documents will be shared. Status: Box A
