The operations of the company on the ground has caused Water Pollution to the farm around the plantation.;

b. Lack of transparency

Regarding the benefit sharing of the plasma, the plasma farmers stated that they still have to pay different types of bills in the form of cuts, so the average plasma farmer only receives a net result of 1.36% of the total of the land granted to the company (complainant has provided the evidence of this allegations);

#### 5. Potential Complaints

#### a) Aceydesa (Honduras)

Major unrest is brewing in Honduras post the elections. There were a series of reports in the foreign press relating to the land around Baja Aguan area, at a concession owned by one of RSPO's certified members, Aceydesa. The allegations are related to land grabbing, social and FPIC related issues amongst the Garifuna indigenous community. Since it's a certified unit, our certification team has already contacted the CB, Control Union, who is supposed to initiate a re-audit. This was initially scheduled for the 8<sup>th</sup> December 2017 but given the current unrest, they have postponed it to this year. We are on standby and have received a media query from a Swiss press source and we have given our usual response. This matter is on high alert.

### b) Bumi Sawit Kencana II (Central Kalimantan) / Wilmar International

An incident happened on 18 December 2017, at a Wilmar concession in Central Kalimantan, where 2 workers were allegedly shot by the BRIMOB. They are currently hospitalized in Sampit. Upon receiving the information on 20 December morning, CH immediately followed up with the company giving them 24 hours to respond. We later received letters from several NGOs notifying us of the incident. Wilmar responded on 21 December 2018 alleging that it was an incident involving several workers attempting to steal FFB. Wilmar's security forces had allegedly tried to control the situation but when the individuals allegedly resisted they had sought the assistance of the Brimob. The BRIMOB allegedly first shot up in the air followed by shooting at the workers. They had allegedly used rubber bullets but the workers were still injured.

The NGO has responded to RSPO, they were asking on the classifications of the complaints as formal and others as not formal. As this is not a formal complaint, there will no information related to this case on the case tracker. This case is still under the investigation of the police. We haven't received any updates on this.

#### c) PT. Permata Putera Mandiri and PT. Putera Manunggal Perkasa (ANJ Group), (West Papua, Indonesia)

This is related to the information on the excessive use of force against a community member by the BRIMOB at one of PT ANJ's concession in West Papua. On 14<sup>th</sup> December 2017, we received a letter from several NGOs including FPP, Yayasan Pusaka and Greenpeace, directed to the Secretariat and asking the Secretariat to lodge a complaint. The allegations were on deforestation and development on disputed land at 2 concessions, PT PMM and PT PMP. The technical team is following up with the company for a response and we are also conducting a GIS mapping to determine if primary forest has indeed been cleared. Technical will advise if this actually warrants being escalated into a formal complaint.

#### 21 February 2018 (CP Meeting)

To make this an official complaint and demand a stop work order or advise the company and make the expectation clear that they must stop. If the Company informs that they have stopped work, they should provide evidence of aerial photographs.

#### 25 April 2018 (CP Meeting)

#### 7.6 Conflict of Interest Issue

There is a current case where the company and the complainant are in the midst of developing a resolution plan which may involve payment of fees to the complainant. Generally, the parties are free to collaborate but where conflict of interest arises, the CP may view the outcome of such collaboration with prejudice. In addition, any payment of fees should be made public and clarified.

#### 8. Amnesty International's Investigation report on Wilmar International

"Amnesty International interviewed 120 workers working on palm plantations owned by two Wilmar subsidiaries and three Wilmar suppliers in Kalimantan and Sumatra in Indonesia. The investigation exposed a wide range of abuses including:

- i. Women forced to work long hours under the threat of having their pay cut, paid below minimum wage and kept in insecure employment without pensions or health insurance;
- ii. Children as young as eight doing hazardous, hard physical work, sometimes dropping out of school to help their parents on the plantation;
- iii. Workers suffering severe injuries from paraquat, an acutely toxic chemical banned in the EU and by Wilmar itself;
- iv. Workers being made to work outdoors without adequate safety;
- v. Workers having to work long hours to meet ridiculously high targets, some of which involve highly physically demanding tasks".

#### 9. Request for Reopening the case: PT Gunta Samba Jaya/PT SIMP

Greenpeace, upon releasing their investigative report, **Dirty Bankers**, which exposes HSBC's role in funding palm oil companies linked to environmental and human rights abuses followed up with RSPO on the PT Gunta Samba Jaya and Indofood/PT SIMP filed in 2013. The case remains unresolved after Indofood CEO Mark Wakeford informed RSPO that "[Indofood does] not have any shareholding in PT Gunta Samba Jaya and it is not part of the IndoAgri or SIMP Group."

Greenpeace claim that their analysis of the company deeds and corporate structures revealed considerable overlap between PT GSJ and its parent companies, and other Salim Group businesses.

In light of this evidence they are formally requesting that the Complaints Panel re-examine the case against PT Gunta Samba Jaya / PT SIMP.

	All Coles brand food and drink products now contain RSPO certified palm oil from physical supply chains. This represents almost all of the palm oil used in Coles brand products. Non-food Coles brand products are made with RSPO certified palm oil from either physical supply chains or book and claim (Green Palm).
	AND
	Coles' brand food and drinks now use sustainable palm oil. More than 3,000 tonnes of palm oil used by Coles comes from a sustainable source. The conversion program for Coles non-food products is also underway and in May 2015, Coles launched Coles Hand Sanitisers with sustainable palm oil. The use of palm oil in Coles Brand non-food products has been offset with GreenPalm certificates while the conversion program take place.
