1. Opening Remarks by Chairperson

Chairman of the Complaints Panel opened the meeting and welcoming everyone.

2. Declaration of "No Conflict of Interest"

1 CP members had a conflict of interest in 1 cases being deliberated. She will abstain from taking part in the deliberation and decision in this case.

3. Minutes of the meeting of 19 April 2017

The minutes of the complaints panel meeting were adopted unanimously.

4. New Complaints

i. PT Agro Muara Rupit, subsidiary of SIPEF filed by Edhy Wardhana (individual) on 17 May 2017

The complainant brought forward the issue of fraudulent land title to the RSPO. The complainant claimed that his land was fraudulently sold by his cousin to PT Agro Muara Rupit. The complainant claimed that this matter was brought forward to the company but the company did not entertain his complaint.

The complainant demand RSPO to review and hold the development the land.

Status: Box A. complaint received.

Updates:

17 May 2017 – Secretariat acknowledged the complaint and proceeds with the initial diagnosis.

The complainant had approached National Land Agency Office in Musi Rawas District.

31 May 2017 - Secretariat is investigating the membership status of the company involved and will update CP on the matter at the next meeting

ii. Food Ingredients (EFKO Group), Filed by Ecological Organization Association/Public Council of Environmental Organization Association in Taman, Russia on 15 May 2017

On 28 February 2017, a court judgement decided to stop "Food Ingredients" business activities in Taman due to gross violation of environmental legislation which leads to stopping the work of piers, production, and all other related activities.

Hundreds of lawsuits are being prepared against EFKO from private citizens and organisation for using low quality palm oil in food production which led to severe damage to human health.

The complainant demand RSPO to terminate RSPO certification of EFKO and its affiliated companies and to check EFKO's suppliers in regard to compliance with RSPO certification standards.

Updates:

EFKO's RSPO membership was terminated on 16 Feb 2015

31 May 2017 – Secretariat is in a process of determining the membership status of the company and its subsidiaries and investigating the complaint.

iii. Supply Chain PT Rezeki Kencana (subsidiary of Julong Group) a supplier of Wilmar International Filed by Link-Ar Borneo on 30 April 2017

It is alleged that PT Rezeki Kencana, which is one of Wilmar's suppliers has breached RSPO P&C by:

- i. developing the land owned by Serikat Tani Darat Jaya from Desa Kampung Baru without proper FPIC (land grabbing);
- ii. Criminalised and intimidate the local community;

Status: Box A. complaints received.

Updates:

12 May 2017 – A joint press conference was organised by Link-Ar Borneo, ELSAM (Institute for Policy Research and Advocacy), and Sawit Watch on the above matter.

31 May 2017 - Secretariat is in a process of determining the membership status of the company involved.

iv. Complaints filed by SCS Global Services (Certification Body) against ASOCOFOR.

The complainant's allegations are on two grounds, namely, the failure of payment by the company and the alleged act of forum shopping by the company when faced with possibilities of not being able to obtain RSPO Certification due to numerous non-compliances.

RSPO LATAM has contacted the company and requested for a chronology of events and an explanation

Update:

19 April 2017 - Comments were received from the Complainants in response to the chronology shared by the Company. This case is still pending further clarification from ASI.

22 May 2017 - The Complainant has provided additional information as requested

31 May 2017 - Secretariat found that ASOCOFOR is a member of RSPO, but Organic Supply is not a member, and the audit is actually conducted under Organic Supply.

Technically, the main issue is about contractual violation and not linked to any of RSPO key document. Secretariat cannot process the case which is based on the contractual violation. It is suggested that both parties to get back to their national regulation.

CP agreed to deliver decision to dismiss the case.

v. Western Pacific Oil filed by MOI Foods USA Inc. on 17 March 2017

Western Palm Oils claimed that they are purchasing MB shortening from MOI Foods. MOI Foods clarified that WPO is not their supplier.

The complainant has withdrawn their complaint 3 days after they submitted their forms to RSPO. They reinstated the complaint 1 week after the withdrawal.

Status: Box B. Complaint Categorised.

Updates:

19 April 2017 - Secretariat has requested the complainant to provide more information and document. Pending for more information from the complainant.

23 May 2017 - The Complainant provided further clarification and this was verified with ASI who had conducted a witness audit.

It was recently discovered that Organic Supply has not obtained RSPO membership. Further clarification was sought from ASI to determine why they had proceeded with certification audit for the second time by Control Union.

31 May 2017 – The Secretariat is still waiting for more information from the complainant.

vi. CPs Decision Regarding Submissions of New Planting Procedures (NPP) related to seven (7) subsidiaries of Goodhope Asia Holdings Ltd.

The NPP documents were submitted by Goodhope Asia Holdings Ltd.'s for the following proposed new developments:

The notification of PT Nabire Baru's NPP on the RSPO website resulted in an official letter of complaints submitted by the Secretariat to the Complaints Panel. It also triggered joint objections from Environmental Investigation Agency (EIA), Forest Peoples' Programme (FPP), Greenpeace and PUSAKA, critiquing the poor quality of the HCV Assessment, amongst others.

The Complaints Panel, within it mandate, has deliberated on this case on the basis of the *i) RSPO*Secretariat's letter; *ii) official joint objections on PT Nabire Baru by EIA, FPP, Greenpeace and PUSAKA; iii)*external independent review of HCV Assessments; *iv) internal reviews of the NPP submissions; v) the*fundamental objectives of the RSPO Complaints System1; and vi) GA 12 Resolution 6(H)

Updates:

19 April 2017 - CP decided to impose stop-work orders in relation to the above subsidiaries. Further recommendations were also made by the CP requiring the company to complete the LUCA and re-do its HCV Assessments.

Secretariat to draft a letter and send it to the Complaints Panel for review.

23 May 2017 - A letter adopting precautionary measures was issued by the CP on 28 April 2017 for the 7 concessions of Goodhope. It included time-bound stop work orders for all 7 concessions.

31 May 2017 - The Complaints Panel agree to allow the company continue build the mini mill only when all the environmental and legal requirements are already in place.

5. Reported Cases

a. PT Austindo Nusantara Jaya Agri (PT ANJA) filed by Indonesia Labour Union (SERBUNDO) & OPPUK on 6 January 2017

Allegation:

The company has breached RSPO P&C No. 6.6 (The employer respects the rights of all personnel to form and join trade unions of their choice and to bargain collectively.)

The company requested RSPO to facilitate dialogue between Serbundo and the company.

Status: Box A. Complaints received.

Update:

31 May 2017

The labour Union - Serbundo, sent an email informing the update of the case:

i. Regarding the worker issue, the management of PT ANJA Siais organised an internal mediation with one of the worker (Pak Pazarman) on 8 May 2017 and now he has been re-hired by the company and an agreement has been established between both parties.

7.2 June CP Meeting

- i. The June 2017 CP meeting will be held on 14th June 2017 at Central London
 - i. The Secretariat has planned a 2 days meeting with the CP back to back with the EU RT. The meeting planned on 14 & 15 June is to focus on the following:
 - CP Meeting
 - Socialising the new (revamped) Complaints Procedures
 - Discussing the interpretive guidelines which will be drafted to support the new Complaints Procedures
 - Discussing the SOPs.

The Secretariat hopes that all CP members will be able to attend both days of the meeting.

- 19 April 2017 Secretariat to send a formal invite to CP members next week.
- **31 May 2017** Schedule of the meeting has been sent to the Complaints Panel. Secretariat is currently preparing the detail agenda and suggested topics for dialogue session, including the logistic matters.

Secretariat will send out all relevant docs by the end of next week, including the list of participant attending the dialogue.

7.3 Complaints System Revamp

- 21 February 2017 The meeting on Complaints Procedure and Appeal has been conducted. The
 meeting was attended by representative members of the Complaints Panel.
 The final document will be shared internally 2 weeks after the meeting and circulated back to the
 Complaints Panel for further review.
- ii. **22 February 2017** The final version of the Complaints Procedures was shared with the CP. It will be presented to the Board of Governors for endorsement at their April 2017 meeting.
- iii. **19 April 2017** The CP members officially endorsed the (Revised) Complaints Procedures. However, since the April BoG meeting is cancelled, the Secretariat will attempt to get it endorsed at the May 2017 meeting.
- iv. **23 May 2017** A Decision Paper has been submitted to the BoG and the endorsement by the BoG is currently tabled for the June BoG meeting.

7.4 Membership of the Complaints Panel

- **1 May 2017** Bambang Dwi Laksono informed the Chair of the CP and the Secretariat of his resignation as a member of the Panel, with immediate effect.
- **31 May 2017** Secretariat to search for suitable replacement and would expand the search to other regions.

8. Amnesty International's Investigation report on Wilmar International

"Amnesty International interviewed 120 workers working on palm plantations owned by two Wilmar subsidiaries and three Wilmar suppliers in Kalimantan and Sumatra in Indonesia. The investigation exposed a wide range of abuses including:

- i. Women forced to work long hours under the threat of having their pay cut, paid below minimum wage and kept in insecure employment without pensions or health insurance;
- ii. Children as young as eight doing hazardous, hard physical work, sometimes dropping out of school to help their parents on the plantation;
- iii. Workers suffering severe injuries from paraquat, an acutely toxic chemical banned in the EU and by Wilmar itself;
- iv. Workers being made to work outdoors without adequate safety;
- v. Workers having to work long hours to meet ridiculously high targets, some of which involve highly physically demanding tasks".

Update:

19 April 2017 (CP meeting) - Secretariat has discussed the issues with TSH, and asked them to provide an update on actions taken in addressing allegations in the Amnesty International report. Secretariat to send a letter to TSH and request written updates within 2 weeks.

31 May 2017 (CP meeting) - TSH Resource Berhad had just submitted their updates on 18 May 2017. The company is going through a transition as their sustainability head had left the company. The Secretariat will sit down with the new Head of Sustainability and will update CP at the next meeting.

9. Request for Reopening the case: PT Gunta Samba Jaya/PT SIMP

Greenpeace, upon releasing their investigative report, which exposes one financial institution, a member of RSPO role in funding palm oil companies linked to environmental and human rights abuses followed up with RSPO on the PT Gunta Samba Jaya and Indofood/PT SIMP filed in 2013.

Greenpeace claim that their analysis of the company deeds and corporate structures revealed considerable overlap between PT GSJ and its parent companies, and other Salim Group businesses.

In light of this evidence they are formally requesting that the Complaints Panel re-examine the case against PT Gunta Samba Jaya / PT SIMP.
