Agenda item

1. Opening Remarks by Chairperson

The Chair opened the meeting by welcoming everybody and then invited everyone to scrutinize the minutes of the previous meeting.

2. "No Conflict of Interest"

All the members of the complaints panel declared that they have no conflict of interest for the complaint cases they were reviewing.

3. Minutes of the meeting of 26 May 2015

The minutes of the meeting were adopted and confirmed by the members unanimously.

4. New Reported Cases

The following are reported cases received by the RSPO Secretariat and have not yet been deliberated by the Complaints Panel.

1. PT. Kapuas Maju Jaya, PT Dwie Warna Karya, PT Susantri Permai (Genting Plantations Berhad, GPB) –Mitra Lingkungan Hidup Kalimantan Tengah & Forest People Program (FPP) – received on 23 March 2015

The plantation operation is ongoing even though the location permits or IjinLokasi and Izin Usaha Budidaya Perkebunan/ IUP was withdrawn. GPB issued a formal letter dated 25 March 2015, saying that "GPB took over the management of the three PTs only in January 2014. GPB has continued to pursue the renewal of the IjinLokasi and after that, they will proceed for the IUP and Penilaian Usaha Perkebunan/PUP to facilitate ISPO and RSPO certification".

Status: Box A

Update: RSPO shared the letter to FPP on 30 April 2015, no response from the complainant so far. The RSPO Secretariat tried to call the mobile phone of the complainant but was not successful. GPB has answered the allegations on 9 June 2015. RSPO Secretariat will have to wait for further responses from FPP and others.

2. PT Rimba Mujur Mahkota (PT RMM)- Sawit Watch - received on 25 April 2015

Sawit Watch sent a formal letter to PT RMM in North Sumatra, Indonesia to seek clarification regarding the freedom of involvement in labour unions, mutation, demotion, one-sided termination, eviction and intimidation against labour in general, as well as the termination and sealing of the house of Mr. Aronaso Gulo, one of the staff of PT RMM who has been active in Union Serbundo.

PT RMM was alleged to have breached the Indonesian National Law on Manpower, No.13/2003 - article 151 and 155 regarding the procedure of termination against an employee.

Status: Box G (bilateral engagement hastaken place)

Update: RSPO Secretariat facilitated a stakeholders meeting in Medan on 5 June 2015. Formal agreement has been signed, both parties agreed to solve the complainant bilaterally. RSPO Secretariat will monitor the process of such implementation.

3. PT Tolan Tiga (Sipef Group) –Lembaga Pemuda Pemerhati Lingkungan Hidup (LPPLH) – Labusel – received on 25 April 2015

There are 3 points in the allegations:

1) LPPLH alleged that PT TolanTiga has a Land Dispute with the villages of Meranti, Kampung Rakyat and Labuhan

Batu Selatan.

2) PT Tolan Tiga created a land boundary trench with a depth of 2 meters, which is dangerous for motorcycle riders3) The absence of public schools located near to the company, causing the staff's children to travel a long distance to school.

Status: Box H, Case Closed

Update: Clarifications was made by Sipef on 30 April 2015. No response from the complainant so far. The deadline of 22 May 2015 has passed, and therefore, the complaint is closed.

4. WALHI/PT Indo Sawit Kekal Cargill – received on 6 April 2015

The NPP submission, listed a representative of WALHI during the public consultation. But WALHI have complained to RSPO saying that the said representative never represented WALHI at that time and that RSPO was negligent in allowing the publication of the NPP. WALHI says that they are not a RSPO member and by publishing their name in the NPP report, it implies that they are supporting the expansion of oil palm development. This is contrary to their official policy of not supporting oil palm expansion. WALHI is demanding an apology from RSPO. Status: Box B

Update: RSPO Complaints Coordinatormet Cargill on 15 May 2015. They cannot trace the people involved in the case. RSPO to talk to Walhi and reach a satisfactory solution.

5. PT. Gunung Melayu (Asian Agri) – received on 2 March 2015

In Sumatera: Kelompok Tani/Farmer Group Ujung Masehi alleged that PT Gunung Melayu has taken over their land (68.5 hectares) without compensation in Asahan, North Sumatra. The Secretariat has received clarification from the member, PT Gunung Melayu.

Status: Box A

Update: Response from the community was received on 17 May 2015. The second clarification from Asian Agri was received on 1 June 2015. RSPO Secretariat has sent email to the community on 8 June 2015 and will engage with both parties. This case is expected to be closed due to lack of evidence. RSPO Secretariat has sent a formal letter to the Farmer's Group.

6. PT. Unggul Lestari (Musim Mas) - received on 23 January 2015

Kelompok Tani/ Community Group Bhakti Karya in Bukit Indah village, sub district Telaga Antang, District (Kabupaten) Kotawaringin Timur, Central Kalimantan Province, has made a complaint against PT Unggul Lestari. The complaint is about a land claim of 685 hectares. Kelompok and Bhakti Karya alleged that PT Unggul Lestari has taken their land and planted on it without their permission.

Status: Box A

Update: RSPO Secretariat met with Musim Mas on 10 April 2015 in RSPO KL and on 24 April 2015 in RILO Jakarta. The matter was clarified by Musim Mas. Since the deadline (22 May 2015) for providing GPS coordinate has passed, RSPO Secretariat expects to close the case by end June 2015.
