Profile of Organisation:

The Sumatran rhinoceros is the most endangered wildlife species in Malaysia and in Borneo. Borneo Rhino Alliance (BORA) mission and goal is to prevent its extinction in Borneo. This is done by assisting Government of Sabah in implementation of the Borneo Rhino Sanctuary programme, primarily by providing protection to rhinos in Tabin Wildlife Reserve, care of captive rhinos, rhino rescue, and helping to develop breeding facilities for rhinos brought from situations where they cannot contribute to the species' survival. BORA, formerly known as SOS Rhino Borneo, is a non-governmental organization established as a non-profit company under Malaysian law. BORA has 24 full-time staff, 21 based at Tabin, with direction provided by an executive director operating under the guidance of a board of directors.


