#### 4. New Complaints

# a) Woolworths Limited – filed by Palm Oil Investigation on 8 December 2016 Allegations:

- Woolworths is labelling on the pack that the product contains either certified sustainable palm oil OR sustainable palm oil without any RSPO approved audits. Woolworths is using non-RSPO approved financial auditor Deloitte to audit the supply chain certification to back up the claims.
- As Woolworths use close to 1,000 contract manufacturers (not all of which are using palm), it would
  be impossible for all these certifications claims to be correct as there are only around 100 certified
  manufacturers in Australia that have undergone official audits. The majority of these manufacturers
  are NOT contracted by Woolworths.
- It is alleged that Woolworths has breached the RSPO Communications and Claims Rules, RSPO Code of Conducts.

**12 January 2017** – The complaints are separated as individual cases – i) Coles and ii) Woolworth. Complaints team had referred the case to the Communications and Claims (C & C) Standing Committee to provide technical assessment if the allegations are in breach of RSPO Rules on Market Communications and Claims, and/or RSPO Code of Conduct.

C & C Standing Committee will share their final assessment after their meeting on 6 February 2017.

<u>Concerns from POI</u> has been raised during the CP meeting. RSPO respect POI's decision and will discuss this concern internally before responding.

#### 8. Sale of Concessions/subsidiaries with complaints by members

We have had the following members selling their subsidiaries instead of resolving the complaints:

#### i. PT Asiatic Inti Persada/Wilmar

Sold to the Ganda Group (non-RSPO members); we lost control over the complaint.

#### ii. PT Sawit Sumber Sarana/Sawit Mandiri Lestari

The company is sold with the reason that there is a delay in fulfilling the legal/permit requirement so that the company cannot achieve the targets.

#### iii. PT Mitra Austral Sejahtera/Sime Darby

They are considering selling based on the fact that it is not profitable.

#### iv. Plantaciones de Pucallpa

They are planning to sell as advertisements have appeared in Malaysia and Indonesia. The complaint is pending for resolution.

What can RSPO do to prevent non-compliant members from selling or considering selling certifiable units with severe RSPO compliance problems/issues to non-RSPO members?

#### Update:

**24 January 2017** – the Complaints Panel have no further comments on publishing the note of censure on the website.

Regarding the particular case Plantaciones de Pucallpa, the Secretariat has proceeded with the recommendations based on the previous CP meeting. On 20 January 2017 a letter was sent to the Complainants indicating the CP's decision to proceed with the complaints. Independent investigation has been initiated and the Secretariat is waiting for the report from the investigator.

### 10. Amnesty International's Investigation report on Wilmar International

"Amnesty International interviewed 120 workers working on palm plantations owned by two Wilmar subsidiaries and three Wilmar suppliers in Kalimantan and Sumatra in Indonesia. The investigation exposed a wide range of abuses including:

- i. Women forced to work long hours under the threat of having their pay cut, paid below minimum wage and kept in insecure employment without pensions or health insurance;
- ii. Children as young as eight doing hazardous, hard physical work, sometimes dropping out of school to help their parents on the plantation;
- iii. Workers suffering severe injuries from paraquat, an acutely toxic chemical banned in the EU and by Wilmar itself;
