It is alleged that one of Aceites's mill purchasing FFB from operation in the Maria la Baja which collecting FFB from palm grower who pay below the market price, without invoices and from anyone regardless its origin. The FFB was collected without sanitary control and with staff hired outside the regulation of the Ministry of Labour.

It is alleged that the vehicle collecting the FFB during the night, a time with restrictions on mobility imposed by the City Hall. The FFB transferred to Aceites S.A and Palma Aceite located in the Department of Magdalena.

7. Amnesty International's Investigation report on Wilmar International

"Amnesty International interviewed 120 workers working on palm plantations owned by two Wilmar subsidiaries and three Wilmar suppliers in Kalimantan and Sumatra in Indonesia. The investigation exposed a wide range of abuses including:

- i. Women forced to work long hours under the threat of having their pay cut, paid below minimum wage and kept in insecure employment without pensions or health insurance;
- ii. Children as young as eight doing hazardous, hard physical work, sometimes dropping out of school to help their parents on the plantation;
- iii. Workers suffering severe injuries from paraquat, an acutely toxic chemical banned in the EU and by Wilmar itself;
- iv. Workers being made to work outdoors without adequate safety;
- v. Workers having to work long hours to meet ridiculously high targets, some of which involve highly physically demanding tasks".

Greenpeace, upon releasing their investigative report, which exposes one financial institution, a member of RSPO role in funding palm oil companies linked to environmental and human rights abuses followed up with RSPO on the PT Gunta Samba Jaya and Indofood/PT SIMP filed in 2013.

Greenpeace claim that their analysis of the company deeds and corporate structures revealed considerable overlap between PT GSJ and its parent companies, and other Salim Group businesses.
