 - November 2009, Forest Peoples Programme & Sawit Watch organised the Task Force on Smallholder meeting prior to RT7 conference, Kuala Lumpur
 - November 2009, during RT7, Sawit Watch facilitated side meeting for representatives of local community, indigenous peoples, smallholders, and worker with Neste Oil; IOI on land, social and environmental concerns in Sabah and Ketapang; United Plantations on land issues; IFC/World Bank on policy review; Wilmar on supply chain issues; Sime Darby on land and labour issues; and HSBC and Rabobank on community concerns with their palm oil clients.
