Previously as the Global Deputy Director, Market Transformation and Head of India for the Roundtable on Sustainable Palm Oil (RSPO), he supported the formation of I-SPOC - Sustainable Palm Oil Coalition for India and scaled up RSPO's growth and impact in India, China and Asia Pacific. To engage consumers

for sustainable consumption, Kamal led the #KnowYourPalm campaign and built partnerships for Youth for Sustainability (YfS) India Clubs and the YfS India Alliance as a founding and steering committee member. He has also been a member of the World Economic Forum's (WEF) 'Expert Review Panel' and COP26's Forest, Agriculture and Commodity Trade – FACT Dialogue Global Multistakeholder Taskforce.
