Producing sustainable palm oil in Colombia is more related to a cultural mindset than any technical, environmental or legal obstacle. We have found that implementation of standards at the smallholders level usually worries the management, the real challenge is at the mid-sized farmer. DAABON has approached with a teaching attitude, with the facts and numbers to convince on the risk and convenience of producing on a sustainable management system.

This has worked, and we will keep fine tuning our proposal until the area is completely certified.
